YOUR ROLE AS A PARENT

Parents actively participate to:

- identify activities, and learning
- opportunities your child and family enjoy,
- try out some of the practices talked about with your family
- decide which practices work or what needs to be done differently

We know from research that a parent's responsiveness to their child is the key to improving child development.

WHAT'S A PRIMARY COACH?

A Primary Coach will be assigned to work with your family & child. They will visit regularly to:

- Explore activities, learning opportunities, and practices with the parent,
- Try out some of the practices talked about with the family
- Find out what practices work, as well as what might be thought about differently
- Determine if support from another er team member is needed to meet the needs of the child/ family.

WHAT IS BIRTH TO 3?

The first three years are the most important building blocks of a child's future. The Birth to 3 Program supports families of children with developmental delays or disabilities under the age of three. All families want their children to grow to their fullest potential, especially during this formative time. Some children who have developmental delays or disabilities need extra support. One way this support is provided is through early intervention. Wisconsin's early intervention program is known as Birth to 3.

Birth to 3 staff are trained in assessing the development, strengths, and needs of very young children, and determine, along with their parents, if a child is eligible for the program. Once a child is enrolled, families work in partnership with staff to determine which services will best support their child's ability to grow, learn, and communicate.
